This letter is in response to your July 5, 2024, correspondence requesting additional information regarding EAMC-Lanier's reviewability request proposing to convert from an acute care hospital to a rural emergency hospital (REH).

The additional information that you requested is listed below:

The request indicates EAMC-Lanier is currently authorized for fifty-three (53) acute care beds. This bed count includes twenty (24) acute care beds, seventeen (17) inpatient rehabilitation beds, and twenty (20) geriatric psychiatric beds, for a total of sixty-one (61) beds. The Alabama Department of Public Health (ADPH) Facilities Directory lists EAMC-Lanier as a seventy-eight (78) bed general acute care hospital, which includes seventeen (17) inpatient rehabilitation beds and twenty (20) geriatric psychiatric beds. Please provide the agency with a detailed explanation concerning the number of licensed beds, Certificate of Need (CON) authorized beds at the existing medical facility in Chambers County, Alabama.

There was an error in the July 1, 2024, request for reviewability determination that was submitted to the State Health Planning and Development Agency (SHPDA). Currently, EAMC-Lanier is authorized for a total of fifty-three (53) acute care beds which includes *sixteen (16)* acute care beds, seventeen (17) inpatient rehabilitation beds, and twenty (20) geriatric psychiatric beds. EAMC-Lanier requested a decrease in authorized beds in August 2021 and was granted that decrease in authorized beds on October 19, 2021. I have enclosed a copy of the email that was received from ADPH regarding that decrease in authorized beds as well as EAMC-Lanier's licenses for 2021 through 2024 which all state that EAMC-Lanier has an authorized bed count of fifty-three (53). In addition, according to ADPH's health care facilities'

directory available on their website, EAMC-Lanier's authorized bed capacity is fifty-three (53). A printout from that directory is included as well.

Please let me know if you need any additional information. My sincerest apologies for the confusion that the error in the original letter caused. Thank you for your consideration of this reviewability request.

EAMC-Lanier Rural Emergency Hospital Conversion

Dear Ms. Marsal:

On behalf of EAMC-Lanier, I am writing to submit a reviewability determination request in accordance with Section 410-1-7-.02 of the Alabama State Health Planning and Development Agency's Certificate of Need ("CON") Rules and Regulations with regards to converting EAMC-Lanier from an acute care hospital to a rural emergency hospital ("REH"). EAMC-Lanier believes that this conversion is not subject to CON review under the current rules and regulations; however, EAMC-Lanier is asking for a formal opinion from the State Health Planning and Development Agency ("SHPDA").

EAMC-Lanier, formally known as George H. Lanier Memorial Hospital, is in Chambers County and has been serving residents since it opened on January 18, 1950. It is worthy to note that EAMC-Lanier was the first hospital in the nation to qualify for funding under the Hill-Burton Act. Just as the hospital did seventy-four years ago, it continues to serve as a valuable healthcare resource for residents of Chambers County. As a rural hospital, EAMC-Lanier is facing many of the same financial and workforce staffing challenges that other rural hospitals are facing across the country. It is extremely important that the residents of Chambers County have access to quality health care. To ensure that these residents continue to have access to healthcare services, the conversion to a REH is necessary.

The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021 was signed into law on December 27, 2020, and established REHs as a new Medicare provider type to give rural communities more access to health care. Both the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services ("CMS") and the Alabama Department of Public Health ("ADPH") have developed rules and regulations on how a rural general acute care hospital can convert to a REH. A REH must provide twenty-four-hour emergency services and can provide additional outpatient medical and health services that do



not exceed an annual per patient average length of stay of twenty-four (24) hours or greater. In addition, a REH is not allowed to operate any inpatient services.

To qualify to become a REH, a hospital had to be enrolled and certified in Medicare as of December 27, 2020 and be a critical access hospital or a subsection (d) hospital (as defined in section 1886(d)(1)(B) of the Social Security Act) with not more than fifty (50) beds located in a county (or equivalent unit of local government) in a rural area (as defined in section 1886(d)(2)(D) of the Social Security Act) otherwise known as rural hospital. EAMC-Lanier classifies as rural per the REH requirements as EAMC-Lanier is classified as rural on Worksheet S-2 Part 1 of its cost report that covers December 27, 2020.2 Currently, EAMC-Lanier is authorized for a total of fifty-three (53) acute care beds which includes twenty-four (24) acute care beds, seventeen (17) inpatient rehabilitation beds, and twenty (20) geriatric psychiatric beds. Per the REH regulations, REHs are not allowed to operate distinct part units except for skilled nursing facility distinct part units. Furthermore, for REH purposes, the number of beds is calculated by taking the number of available bed days during the cost reporting period and dividing it by the number of days in the cost reporting period both at the time the REH designation was enacted (December 27, 2020) and during the most recent cost reporting period. 3 This calculation confirms that EAMC-Lanier meets the REH requirement of not having more than fifty (50) beds.

To convert to a REH, EAMC-Lanier will discontinue all inpatient services including the services it currently provides in its two distinct part units. If EAMC-Lanier receives a non-reviewable determination from SHPDA, the formal application process with CMS and ADPH will begin. This will include applying for a REH license from ADPH and receiving final approval from CMS.

The current CON thresholds are: \$3,322,582.00 for major medical equipment, \$1,327,734.00 for new annual operating costs, and \$6,638,679.00 for other capital expenditures. All expenditures associated with this conversion will be below these three thresholds.

- 4. Services to be provided: EAMC-Lanier plans to provide twenty-four (24) hour emergency services as well as hospital outpatient services. There will not be any inpatient services provided upon conversion. The same outpatient services that are currently available to the residents of Chambers County at EAMC-Lanier will still be available after the REH conversion. These services include, but are not limited to, outpatient imaging, laboratory services, and rehabilitation services. Other services that will still be available on the EAMC-Lanier campus include nursing home services and ambulatory surgery.
- 5. Financial Breakdown, Approximate Costs:
 Expenditures for the proposed REH conversion are as follows:

Renovation and Construction: \$75,000.00
Equipment and Furnishings: \$ 0.00
New Annual Operating Costs: \$ 0.00

6. Financial Interests:

The East Alabama Health Care Authority is the only entity with a financial interest in this proposed conversion.

Based on the information provided above, we respectfully request your determination that EAMC-Lanier is not required to obtain a CON for its conversion to a REH. An attestation from the requesting party is enclosed. Since EAMC-Lanier is a rural provider, the required filing fee is not required. I appreciate your consideration of this request and welcome the opportunity to address any questions regarding this matter.
